


# CyberStart America

## CyberStart America

([cyberstartamerica.org](http://cyberstartamerica.org)[<http://cyberstartamerica.org/>](http://cyberstartamerica.org/)) will enable up to 100,000 U.S. high school students to play a fun, immersive cybersecurity game where they solve realistic cybersecurity challenges while playing the role of cyber protection agent. They will get to play CyberStart Game through the end of February, and students who complete at least 20% of the challenges will be eligible to enter a scholarship round where they can win \$2,000,000 in scholarships to be used at the colleges they attend.
